

Sport Funding 2016/2017

Funding: £11,640

Base figure of £8,000
+ £3,640 (less than £5 per pupil)

In addition to the sports initiatives introduced last year (see below) the use of the sports funding will further increase opportunities and quality of sports provision in the following ways:

- We will continue to employ specialist sports coaches and swimming teachers to provide expert coaching
- We have arranged a full programme of fixtures for both boys and girls to include football and netball
- To introduce competitive swimming galas against other schools and in house ribbon galas
- To introduce more house competitions in a range of sports i.e. Rugby, Cricket, Netball, Basketball, Tennis and Rounders

From 2015/2016 - the sports funding has been incredibly useful in helping us to provide the following:

- *1 full time swimming coach*
- *1 part time swimming coach*
- *Lifesaving training provided for staff*
- *Level 1 swimming teacher training provided for staff*
- *3 lower school play rangers and sports coaches*
- *9 upper school play rangers and sports coaches*
- *Use of a local authority sports field*
- *Hire of the Thames Valley athletics track*
- *Hire of the Mencap Hall*
- *Purchase of gymnastics and sports equipment*
- *Purchase of swimming equipment*
- *Forged links with East Berkshire College which has enabled the children to utilise specialist facilities and be introduced to new sports not previously taught.*
- *A number of staff trained in Creative Development and have implemented a new program for gym and dance*
- *Joined the Slough School's Sports League which enabled us to participate and excel in local tournaments and matches.*
- *Training and inset days for staff*
- *Children took part in many workshops and competitions with other schools in Slough*

The funding has had a very positive impact upon provision and outcomes have been good. The children are developing good sporting skills and are also proving to be successful in competitive situations as can be evidenced by the list of match fixture results below:

Review of the Year 2016/2017

Upper School pupils still enjoy taking part in their annual Sports Days at the Thames Valley Athletics track, where the children showcase their running, jumping and throwing skills. The fastest children take part in the Sprint finals. Medals are awarded for sprints and 400m long distance.

Upper School children have the advantage of going to the East Berkshire College 2 – 3 times a week with the EBC students. This is a great link between Langley Hall and EBC and is an arrangement that has been in place for 4 years now. Some EBC students take part in a voluntary scheme, helping with afterschool sports clubs. Two students have been exceptional and were invited to attend interviews for vacant positions. They were both successful and are now working full-time at the school.

Inter-house competitions take place each term, which give children the chance to work as a team, show comradery and showcase their brilliant leadership skills.

Sports Mark

During 2016 – 2017 Langley Hall went from Silver to Gold Mark. Much evidence was collated and shown to the Area Manager who visited us and promoted us to Gold Mark with glowing colours. She said we had a wonderful PE team who were dedicated to delivering an extremely high level of teaching to children. It was also remarked on the outstanding number of Sports clubs available, offering an amazing variety of different sports to children. The number of external fixtures (matches/tournaments) that were arranged and won was incredible.

Langley Hall is one of only a few schools in Berkshire to be awarded the Gold Mark.

Langley Hall is planning to achieve the Platinum Mark in 2018. We are also working towards Gold in the Youth Sports Trust.
