Langley Hall Primary Academy is bidding to bag a massive cash boost from the Tesco Bags of Help initiative.

Tesco has teamed up with Groundwork to launch the monthly funding scheme, which sees grants of £5,000, £2,000 and £1,000 – all raised from the 5p bag levy – being awarded to local outdoor community projects.

Three groups in every Tesco region have been shortlisted to receive the cash award and this month shoppers are being invited to head along to Tesco stores to vote for who they think should take away the top grant.

Langley Hall Primary Academy is one of the groups on the shortlist!

Our project is called "**Park, Play and Learn**"

To enable parents to park when dropping their children at school, our playground is a multi-functional space. This means that learning zones need to be imaginatively created using flexible and mobile resources. We have planned out playground area (see diagram below) to enable us to provide exciting outside learning opportunities for our children that are mobile. We want to use the Tesco Bags of Help funding to provide mobile outdoor seating to create a covered reading area, with weather proof book trolley, books and storage area for dressing up costumes to compliment the drama zone. This will make such a huge difference for our children and their learning during play times and holiday clubs which are open to all members of the local community.

"We've been thrilled to see the diversity of projects that have applied for funding, ranging from outdoor classrooms, sports facilities, community gardens, play areas and everything in between.


"We're looking forward to learning the results of the customer vote and then supporting each group to bring their project to life."
