It is essential that all children have the school coat. It is very practical and warm and has many safety features. No other coat is allowed.

Boys in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 should wear the school cap. In the winter all girls except Year 6 should wear the school winter hat. On very cold days children may swap their normal hats for school issue woollen hats, scarves and gloves. Children do not have to have these items but no other woollen hats, scarves or gloves should be worn other than school issue.

In the summer all girls except Year 6 should wear the summer boater. Children may wear the school issue sun hat at break times which is available from the school office. Children should not wear the sun hats to school.

All children should have the school issue rucksack.

Thank you for helping us to ensure that all children are dressed ready for work.



At Langley Hall Primary Academy we encourage children to take a pride in their appearance. We appreciate that the purchase of uniform is a significant investment but we believe it is worthwhile as it has a direct impact upon children's learning and upon their state of mind when in school. Wearing uniform eliminates peer pressure and brings equality to the school community. Some items of uniform may be purchased from any supplier that sells standard school garments, for example, boys black trousers, boys white shirts and girls short puff sleeved blouses. Other items of clothing are very specific to our school and it is essential that all children have these garments. For example, the school coat, school tie, jumper and cardigan.





When parents decide to send their child to Langley Hall we ask them to agree to support our uniform policy by signing our Home/School Agreement. For children for whom we are claiming pupil premium, half of the cost of the uniform is paid for from our School Governors Fund. In cases of hardship, lost property that is unlabelled and unclaimed is given out to parents who request assistance. Please ensure that EVERY item of clothing your child wears to school, including underwear, is clearly labelled. We can accept no responsibility for lost or damaged items although we will work hard to ensure that your child takes care of their belongings.





We all need to dress appropriately for the activities we are doing and children are no exception.

All children should have the school tracksuit for sports lessons. As the jogging bottoms are plain black they may be purchased from any retailer.

Children may be told that they can come to school in their tracksuit on swimming and/or games days. Your child's class teacher will tell you if this is the case.
